Torrey DeKeyser Elected as Chairperson of the Prevent Blindness Board of Directors

CHICAGO (March 5, 2018) – [Prevent Blindness](#), the nation's oldest volunteer eye health and safety organization, has announced that Torrey DeKeyser, Executive Director of the [EyeSight Foundation of Alabama](#) (ESFA), has been elected as Chairperson of the Prevent Blindness Board of Directors. The vote was held on March 2, at the 2018 Prevent Blindness Spring Board of Directors Meeting in St. Petersburg, Fla.

She is also a member of the Kiwanis Club of Birmingham, the Birmingham Women's Committee of 100, the American Heart Association (AHA) Circle of Red, and the Junior League of Birmingham as a Sustainer.
