A cataract is the clouding of the normally clear lens of the eye most commonly caused by aging.<sup>6</sup> An ophthalmic surgeon removes the cloudy lens and replaces it with a clear, artificial implant called an intraocular lens (IOL).<sup>7</sup> According to the U.S. National Eye Institute, cataract surgery is one of the safest, most common and effective surgical procedures performed in the United States.<sup>8</sup> In most cases, people experience improved vision after the procedure.<sup>8</sup>
